

Johann Gutenberg invented the first printing press hundreds of years ago and it was made from wood. In the 1800s, the first printing press made from iron was invented – the Columbian Printing Press.



George Clymer

A man called George Clymer invented the Columbian Press in America. He liked America so much, he called his brand new printing press after it (the word Columbia is an old fashioned name for America, named after Christopher Columbus who discovered the country).

He also put symbols of America on his machine, like the eagle.


So other countries decided that they would decorate their printing presses with symbols of their own.
